


Annulment?

The Road to Discipleship: A voice came from heaven

"Father, glorify your name." Glory is the characteristic of God. Glory—brightness, dignity, beauty, majesty, splendour, honour—is given to God by God's people. Glory is (or should be) given to all that is connected to God: the Holy Trinity, all God's people, and the entirety of God's creation. As God's people, we are called to give God the glory in everything that we do with our lives.

Greeks (non-Jews) have come to the disciples and asked to see Jesus. Jesus' discourse is capped with the words, "I, when I am lifted up, will draw all people to myself." Our neighbours include all God's people. How do we give each person we encounter glory and dignity?


