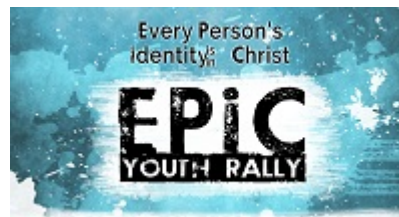
Day of Information Sharing
