On-Call Hospital Chaplaincy

Policy No. 413

Policy Statement: All priests will assist with on-call hospital chaplaincy in their

respective deaneries.

Intent of Policy: To provide hospitalized Catholics with the sacraments and pastoral

care in a timely manner.

Definition: On-call hospital chaplaincy is a response to a particular need of the

faithful while hospitalized, i.e. Anointing of the Sick, Reconciliation,

Viaticum, and pastoral or spiritual counsel.

On-call hospital chaplaincy may be scheduled or unscheduled.

On-call hospital chaplaincy includes acute care hospitals, community

care centres, auxiliary hospitals and nursing homes.

Procedure: Each deanery is to coordinate an on-call schedule with the priests of

their deanery.

Exceptions: a) The University Hospital on-call schedule is coordinated from the

Office of Pastoral Care.

b) Priests who are disabled or elderly may be excused from on-call

hospital chaplaincy with the permission of the Archbishop.
