Membership in a Church sui iuris by Reception into Full Communion

Reception of Persons Baptized in Eastern Churches

Policy No. 622

Policy Statement:

Baptized non-Catholics of an Eastern rite (Orthodox Christians) coming into full communion with the Catholic Church are to retain their own rite and be ascribed to the Church *sui iuris* of that same rite.

Procedure:

- a) Baptized non-Catholics of an Eastern rite who request full communion with the Catholic Church are to be referred to the corresponding Eastern Catholic Church before beginning any catechesis in a Latin parish.
- b) A Latin pastor may receive a baptized Eastern non-Catholic into full communion if the proper Eastern Catholic Church *sui iuris* is not accessible. For example, a Greek Orthodox becomes a member of the Greek Catholic Church; a Syrian Orthodox becomes a member of the Syrian Catholic Church, etc. In registering the reception, it must be noted that the person is a member of the comparable Eastern Church *sui iuris*.
- c) The basic requirement for the reception of a baptized non-Catholic of an Eastern rite is a free decision to be received and a profession of the Catholic faith (i.e. proclamation of the Creed) after appropriate catechesis and spiritual formation. No other obligation is to be imposed on them.

Exception: Exceptions to this policy constitute a transfer requiring permission.
