Journey with St. Joseph

Novena in preparation for Catholic Education Sunday

In *Jesus, the Way, the Truth, and the Life*, Marcellino D'Ambrosio, includes the vital role Joseph played in Jesus' life. He points out that Joseph served as a mentor for Jesus, a teacher for the child Jesus, making him an ideal companion as we journey to Catholic Education Sunday.

Each day of this Novena, we will begin with the Shema, the Jewish confession of faith made up of Deuteronomy 6:4–9 and 11:13–21 and Numbers 15:37–41. Joseph would have taught and prayed this prayer with Jesus.

We will draw from scripture and tradition to focus our reflection, offer a suggested prayer starter in response, and conclude with the Memorare to Saint Joseph and the Litany for St. Joseph from the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops.

DAY ONE- October 28

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Reading: Matthew 1:18-25

Reflection:

Like Mary, the angels' visit to Joseph is an invitation to a great act of faith. He is called to accept the responsibility of caring for Mary and the unborn child.

Prayer response:

DAY THREE- October 30

Reflection:

Joseph travelled to Bethlehem with Mary for the census in obedience to the decree in trust and faith. Despite his having extended family there, Joseph could not find accommodation. They were relegated to a stable. For sure, this was not what Joseph would have wanted. Yet, while they were there, Jesus was born. Joseph would have assisted in the birth. He would have been the first to see and welcome Jesus.

Prayer response:

Joseph, I can't imagine your discouragement, your exhaustion. You did the best you could to provide for Mary. But. You were there, granted the tremendous grace of assisting Jesus into the world. Please help me to trust the call to bring Jesus into our world daily. Particularly today, I sense the need for and am feeling

DAY FOUR- October 31

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Reading: Luke 2:21

Reflection:

On the eighth day, Jesus was circumcised as prescribed by Jewish law. Scripture does not give details. Who? Where? No doubt, Joseph would have brought the infant Jesus. Women were not typically included. Did Joseph hold the child, or did he actually perform the circumcision? Here, we see Joseph carrying out his role as a father (foster father) and taking the first step in bringing Jesus up within the vision of the covenant.

Prayer response:

Joseph, as a Catholic educator, I am called to support parents as they seek to raise their children in the faith. Intercede for me that I may truly appreciate this great privilege. Today, I especially ______ as I am feeling _____.

DAY FIVE- November 1

You shall teach them thoroughly to your children, and you shall speak of them when you sit in your house and when you walk on the road, when you lie down and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign upon your hand, and they shall be for a reminder between your eyes. And you shall write them upon the doorposts of your house and upon your gates.

Reading: Luke 2: 22-35

Reflection:

Again, we see Mary and Joseph acting in fulfillment of the law. They travelled to Jerusalem to bring Jesus to the temple. This would be the first of many such journeys with him. While they were there, Simion held the six-week-old child, praising God for him and prophesying his future. He addresses Mary, but Joseph is there. He hears the prediction of the sword piercing Mary's heart. His own heart must have been pierced at that moment.

Reflection:

Joseph has led his family to safety in Egypt. When Herod dies, the angel again appears to Joseph in a dream, directing him to return to Nazareth with Mother and Child. Joseph was sensitive to the angel's guidance along the way as they travelled.

Prayer response:

Reading: Luke 2:39; 2:59

Reflection:

We find Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus home from Jerusalem after presenting him in the temple. We hear no details in scripture other than "The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom, and the favour of God was upon him." We pick up twelve years later when the Holy Family travelled to Jerusalem. Once more, there are not many details in scripture. Jesus remained behind and then obediently followed Mary and Joseph. What we read there is "And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour." Joseph is Jesus' mentor for growing spiritually and learning a trade.

Prayer response:

Joseph, many of us are educators, others, parents. Others have been called to
serve in both roles. Help us see that we are called to mentor our children as you
did in Jesus' growth and development. Today I saw these opportunities

Reflection:

Scripture does not document Joseph's death. We know he would have died sometime between Jesus turning thirteen and thirty when he began his public ministry. We can imagine Joseph assisted by Jesus and Mary, filled with peace as he died. Who shall ever be able to understand the sweetness, the consolation, the blessed hope coming from Jesus and Mary?

Prayer response:

Joseph, the Church has named you a patron of a happy death. Your death is seen as peaceful and loving, having Mary and Jesus at your side. Many today do not have that experience. There is often fear, guilt or confusion. Be with those who have to face death alone or want to control their death, seeking medical assistance in dying.
