Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the prayer Adsumus Sancte Spiritus, the first word of the original Latin, meaning, "We stand before You, Holy Spirit," which has been historically used at Councils, Synods and other Church gatherings for hundreds of years, and is attributed to Saint Isidore of Seville (c. 560 - 4 April 636). As we embrace this Synodal Process, this prayer invites the Holy Spirit to be at work in us so that we may be a community and a people of grace. For the Synodal journey from 2021 to 2023, we propose to the following simplified version,¹ so that any group or liturgical assembly can pray it more easily.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

What is a Synod?

Synod derived from the Greek "to walk with" and expresses the idea of journeying together.

Canon 342 of the Code of Canon Law,

a synod is an assembly of bishops chosen from the different regions and episcopal conferences from around the world, who meet on specific occasions to foster close union between the Pope and the Bishops

Goal is to have the opportunity to exchange information and share experiences with each other with the common goal of seeking pastoral solutions that have universal validity and application.

Synods do not have the power to legislate, they are purely consultative.





How is this Synod different?

- Pope is looking for the participation of not only the Bishops, but of all the faithful of the Church,
- First time since the Synod of Bishops was established at opening discussions are decentralized,
- Holy Father wants to hear from all corners of the world, for all of us to listen to each other and the Holy Spirit,

This synod is an opportunity to listen to what we have to do as a FAITH community walking together toward God.





What the Synod is NOT Pitfalls to avoid...the temptation

- of wanting to lead ourselves instead of being led by God
 to focus on ourselves and our immediate concerns
 to only see "problems"
 of focusing only on structures
 not to look beyond the visible confines of the Church
 to lose focus on the objectives of the Synodal process
 of conflict and division
- to treat the Synod as a kind of parliament or town hall meeting
- ➤ to listen only to those who are already involved in Church activities
 - > of simplifying this process to the level of a "to do" list





2014 – Synod on the Family: Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelization

2015 – Synod on the Family: The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and in the Contemporary World

2018 – Synod on Young People, Faith, and Vocational Discernment

2019 – Synod of Bishops for the Pan-Amazon Region where the purpose was to identify new paths for the evangelization







Participation Matters

Participate in the consultation(listening) Diocesan phase with ferverent prayer and discernment,

Listen to the voice of others including the baptized, unafiliated, marganilized, and those on the peripheries,

Listen with an open ear and speak with courage and wisdom, inspired by the Holy Spirit and rooted in prayer,

5.3 The Main Question for Consultation

A Synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." How is this "journeying together" happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together"? (PD, 26)

In responding to this question, we are invited to:

- ✓ Recall our experiences: What experiences of our local Church does this question call to mind?
- Re-read these experiences in greater depth: What joys did they bring? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered? What wounds did they reveal? What insights have they elicited?
- Gather the fruits to share: Where in these experiences does the voice of the Holy Spirit resound? What is the Spirit asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for change, the steps to be taken? Where do we register a consensus? What paths are opening up for our local Church?

In responding to these questions, it is helpful to remember that "journeying together" occurs in two deeply interconnected ways. First, we journey together with one another as the People of God. Next, we journey together as the People of God with the entire human family. These two perspectives enrich one another and are helpful for our common discernment towards deeper communion and more fruitful mission.

Who is Who?

Synod Coordinator (Eugenia) Main contact person, design engagement plan, materials, and resources, work in a synodal manner with Archbishop Smith and Senior leads and with the Synod Advisory Committee, local coordinators, and listening leaders. My role is to journey alongside others so that I am able to write ten page synthesis report that captures the Holy Spirit inspired voice of our Archdiocese.

Synod Advisory Council: Diverse leaders within the Archdiocese that are experts in their respectful field. They are collaborative, effective communicators, familiar with structure and process, and have extensive ties within their communities. They are humble, gracious, prayerful, faith filled leaders who wish to serve.

Local Coordinators/leaders: Identified within their respective communities who will serve as the liason between their parish/organization and the Synod Coordinator (Eugenia). Commit to remaining informed about what is happening and sharing this information in a timely and systematic manner. Commit to attend the Learn about the Synod Information and how to facilitate a Listening Session.

Listening Leaders: Identified within their respective communities as having strong communication skills. Trusted and well respected members of the community who understand process and can model respectful speaking and listening. Commit to attend the Learn about the Synod and how to facilitate a Listening Session

Participants: People of God who through prayerful discernment are inspired by the Holy Spirit to respond to the Synod Questions with courage. Understand that speaking and listening to one another is grounded, first and foremost, to listening to the Word of God.
