## Rebuilding Sacred Heart Church of the

### First Peoples

- 1913: Sacred Heart Parish created to welcome and support the many needs of the increasing number of nationalities arriving with Edmonton's rapid population growth.
- October 27, 1991: to the joy of many, Archbishop Joseph McNeil declared Sacred Heart the first, national, First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Catholic Church. On that historic day, Lucienne Meeks, First Nation Elder & Pastoral Associate said: "This is a dream come true. Using our own way of prayer as First Nations people, to be able to worship in freedom and acceptance of who we are and taking our rightful place with Christianity as native Catholics."
- August 30, 2020: a fire in the sanctuary area caused significant damage.
- 2021: the Archdiocese and the Parish take the opportunity to rebuild and profile the national Indigenous Catholic Parish.
- The next 100 years: plans are now unfolding to continue journeying together to build a loving and welcoming Christian community of inclusivity, equality and wellness - welcoming all as brothers and sisters in the Lord in a Catholic context of the



culture and spirituality of the First Peoples of Canada.

## Planning for the Future

- We acknowledge that Sacred Heart Church of the First Peoples is, first and foremost a church, a place of worship of historical importance. It is in a location where the poorest and most vulnerable in society live.
- We have gathered ideas from Indigenous teachings, symbols, ceremonies, Catholic scriptures, and customs that reflect the coming together of both traditions.
- In collaboration with elders, Indigenous leaders, artists, and architects, planning has begun to design a renewed church building combining Indigenous and Catholic elements integral to our spiritual understanding.
- At present, we are restoring the physical structure, modernizing the supporting framework for the spiritual environment.
- The interior redesign is intended to incorporate Aboriginal cultures and spiritualities. It includes a medicine wheel, a redesigned circular altar, replacement of three damaged stained-glass windows, and repairing the Indigenous representation of the Way of the Cross. The integration of Indigenous elements will support liturgies and sacramental celebrations that truly reflect the culture of those gathered together in Indigenous Catholic community.
- There is a new chapel, a place for focusing on the Creator's gift to repair and rebuild brokenness and a path to restoring ourselves, and, the past, with an eye to future generations.
