"SAME, SAME, OR NOT SO SAME"

This year has gotten off to a rather different start for me. I was ordained as a Deacon on May 26th and spent my summer helping at Our Lady of Victory Camp and attending World Youth Day in Portugal. Both were very positive experiences, challenging me to grow in different ways.

You'd think that after eight years of formation, I'd have a pretty good idea about what to expect at the seminary, but you'd be wrong, at least partially. It has been a bit surreal for me these past few months, realizing that I am in my final year of seminary formation. Everything seems the same, but I am different.

I am a very different person now than I was when I entered seminary eight years ago, and rightly so: my formation is working. And yet, in many ways, I don't feel too different. I'm still me - ordination hasn't changed that. What has changed is my role in the community and how others perceive me.

People look to me for direction and instruction in a different way now that I am a Deacon. In some ways, I am an authority figure. In others, I am just another seminarian. This change in identity is something that I have spent time thinking about. One way that this change is seen is in my ministry. In previous years, I have helped at youth groups, schools, RCIA, St. Vincent de Paul, and couples' groups. As a Deacon, I now spend almost every Sunday in parishes, assisting the priest and preaching once a month. People treat me differently now that I wear a collar.

I am immediately put into a position of trust, people seem to share with and ask things of me more readily than even six months ago: asking for help with difficult relationships with God and others, house and car blessings, administering the sacraments, etc. I have been humbled by the support I have received from the people in the parishes. In many ways, I don't feel like I deserve ordination? I've put the time in, but I haven't done anything special. And yet, it seems that saying 'yes' is enough.

Newman Theological College is a place for everyone! It offers a rich selection of graduate, undergraduate and certificate programs that prepare men and women for service and leadership roles in the Church, here in Edmonton as well as the wider community across Western Canada.
