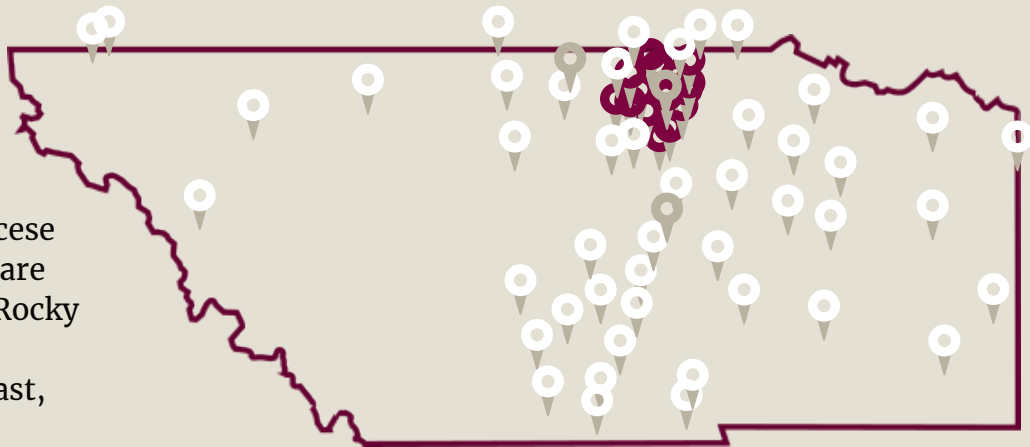

DEANERIES

All parishes in the Archdiocese are grouped into eight regional Deaneries, made up of parish priests and permanent deacons, along with chaplains, retired priests, and clergy who serve the whole Archdiocese. Deaneries provide a clear path from the Archbishop to the people of God and offer the faithful a means to have their voices heard at the Archdiocesan level. They also provide an opportunity for our clergy to grow in fraternity, pray together and share common concerns and solutions. All deaneries separately but simultaneously meet several times a year to discuss diocesan business and coordinate activities within their own deaneries. Each Deanery is led by a Dean and Vice Dean, who meet with the Archbishop and diocesan leadership several times a year.

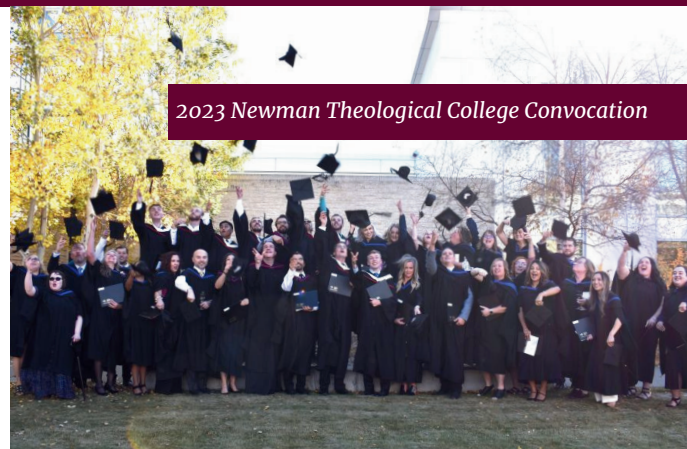
Publicly-funded Catholic education in Alberta received strong words of support at the ACSTA MLA Reception, last March in Edmonton. Archbishop Richard Smith joined 60 representatives from 15 Catholic school divisions, as well as some 30 MLAs – including the Premier, Opposition Leader, Minister of Education, and Education Critic. The annual reception is an opportunity for Catholic school trustees to engage with and educate provincial legislators about the history, constitutional protections, and current significance of Catholic education in Alberta.

COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS OF ALBERTA

CCSSA's goal is to increase collaboration among Catholic leaders as a means to ensure our schools remain authentically Catholic. In November, the CCSSA adopted a new governance structure. Previously governed by a small Executive Committee, the new structure has several key changes. The Council now has members from each of the Dioceses in Alberta, the Northwest Territories, and Yukon. Archbishop Richard Smith joined the CCSSA board in 2023, as the new Alberta Bishop Liaison to education.

GRATEFUL ADVOCATES FOR CATHOLIC EDUCATION

GrACE is grateful to the Edmonton Catholic School District for hosting its fourth annual GrACE Summit in ECSD's new Lumen Christi Centre. The summit offered more than 140 registrants the opportunity to learn, share, reconnect, and be inspired by great speakers and great conversations with one another.

On May 27, 170 former Camp Encounter campers, staff, counsellors and board members, along with their families and friends, gathered on the shores of Lac La Nonne to say a final farewell to the Camp Encounter property.

MARCH FOR LIFE

Over 600 people, including many young Catholics, attended the March for Life on May 11 on the Alberta Legislature grounds. This annual, peaceful demonstration gives witness to the beauty and dignity of every human person.

C-YEG YOUNG ADULT COMMUNITY

Hundreds of young adults across the Archdiocese came together at over 20 events hosted by C-YEG in 2023. The Edmonton-based group provides opportunities for young adults to encounter Christ through fellowship, worship, and service.

OLVC RELAUNCH

One hundred fifty alumni, families, supporters, and volunteers joined Archbishop Richard Smith for the relaunch of Our Lady of Victory Camp on July 8. Rain didn't dampen the spirits of 55 high school students who spent July 9-13 at camp. It was the first week of camp since OLVC was re-launched. The camp welcomed 280 young people over four weeks of camp programming.

ADOREMUS

Over 150 young Catholics gathered once a month to adore Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist at St. Joseph Basilica. *Adoremus* is offered by Newman Theological College's St. Benedict XVI Institute every first Saturday, September to June.



WALKING TOGETHER



INDIGENOUS RECONCILIATION FUND PROJECTS SELECTED

The Indigenous Reconciliation Discernment Circle, made up of local indigenous leaders within the Archdiocese of Edmonton, recommended 34 projects to support a national commitment towards healing and reconciliation with First Nation, Inuit and Métis people. The local projects are funded through the Archdiocese of Edmonton's \$3.2 million, five-year commitment to the national Indigenous Reconciliation Fund. HEALING HAPPENS AMID STORMS AT LAC STE. ANNE PILGRIMAGE

Thousands of Indigenous Canadians from across Canada made the pilgrimage to Lac Ste. Anne in July for healing, worship and fellowship. The pilgrimage site was blessed by Pope Francis during his penitential journey to Canada in 2022. Heavy rainstorms cut short the pilgrimage by two days. Nonetheless, pilgrims said the annual event touched them deeply and that the struggles with the storm highlighted the goodness and resilience of many people.



OUTSTANDING SERVICE FOR "CHURCH AND POPE"

Chief Wilton Littlechild, member of the Ermineskin Cree Nation, residential school survivor, former Grand Chief of The Confederacy of Treaty Six First Nations, and former Commissioner for Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and Marion Haggarty-France, Mission Advancement Lead for the Archdiocese of Edmonton and Alberta Sites Coordinator for the 2022 Papal Visit to Canada, received the *Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice* ("For Church and Pope") Papal Award for their outstanding work on the visit. The awards were presented at a reception and dinner at the Chateau Laurier in Ottawa in March.



ARCHIVES READING ROOM

The Archives Reading Room re-opened in November, after being closed for several years. Genealogy researchers and individuals can, once again, search our digitized sacramental registers. The service is open to everyone but has special meaning to many Indigenous people, who use sacramental records to supplement information related to residential school attendance or to prepare family trees to obtain Metis citizenship, Treaty status or harvesting rights. 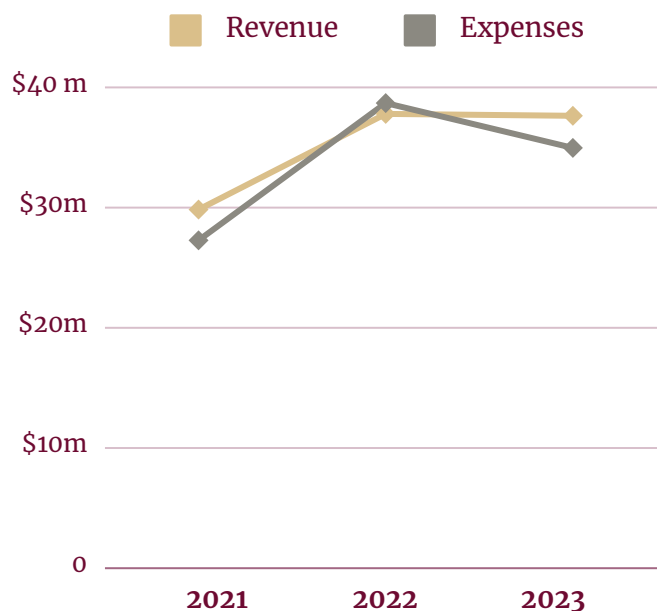

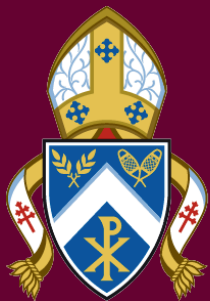
